In order to facilitate an open and respectful exchange of ideas, the organizers ask that all participants abide by the following guidelines and standards:

Treat all participants and presenters with dignity and respect. Engage in good faith dialogue with an empathetic, receptive mind. Interruptions of presentations are prohibited.

The organizers reserve the right to enforce these guidelines and standards in order to create a space that is free of intimidation, negative judgement, and condescension. If any participant violates these guidelines, our session chairs and conference organizers reserve the right to ask you to leave at any time.
